

A Polite Request...

We have had reports from parent, who have been experiencing ongoing problems with head-lice. Could I ask that you please all regularly check your child's head to make sure that they are clear. TALK HOMEWORK & WOW WORDS

Each week we send a Talk Homework activity and 'Wow' Words home and we would be very grateful for your support.

We are trying to help all our children develop excellent speaking and listening skills, which in turn will help them with their writing. "If a child can't say a sentence then they can't write it either!"

We talk a lot in school about E-safety and how to stay safe while we are using devices that connect us to the internet. One of the most critical things that we can all do is to talk to each other. Parents and carers to talk to their children about what they are doing online, what they are writing and who they are communicating with. Children to talk to their parents and carers if they are unsure of what they have seen online or if they are receiving anything that upsets them. worry or feel scared.
