#### Holt Hall Parent Meeting

On **Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> February** there is a meeting for parents whose children are going on the year 4 residential trip at **3:30pm.** This will be a chance to hear about the trip and ask any questions that you may have regarding their time away.

#### Smart Watches

We have noticed a growing number of children who are wearing Smart Watches to school. Some of these watches have the capacity to take photos and send and receive messages. These functions are not acceptable in school. If your child's watch can take pictures or send or receive messages please can we ask that you keep them at home. As you are aware we have to be so careful with data protection and laws regarding consent. We do not have consent for all pupils in school to have their photos taken. As we do not allow pupils to carry mobile phones in school, the messaging facility on Smart Watches would potentially cause the same issues that a mobile phone presents, so again we ask that these devices remain at home. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.



Hopefully you will be aware of a letter I sent out to all parents and carers this week regarding our Friends Group at school. We are looking to start a brand new Friends of OCJS group ASAP but definitely by the end of this academic year. #### Winter Weather - Finding out if the School is Open!

We are now entering the time of year when it is possible that we may have snow or adverse weather conditions which means we have to take the difficult decision to close the school. I am sure you will acknowledge that it is a very difficult decision to make and is never taken lightly. In some circumstances closure is unavoidable, for example where there would not be enough staff on the school site to ensure pupils' safety or the school site cannot be cleared sufficiently to ensure everyone's safety on the premises. We also have to take into account the travelling conditions and risk assess whether pupils, parents and staff can travel to and from school safely. Information regarding whether Old Catton Junior School is closed and a list of all schools which are closed can be found on the website www.schoolclousures.norfolk.gov.uk As well as publishing the information on the website, Norfolk County Council will also highlight closures on the local radio stations and on our Facebook and Twitter channels using #norfolkwinter. In the situation where there has been snowfall and our school is open, pupils will only be able to play outside in the snow at break time and lunchtime if they have suitable clothing and footwear for the conditions. E.g. wellington boots or snow boots, warm clothing, winter coats, gloves and hats.



#### End of the school day.

Please can I reinforce the importance of the way that we operate the school gates at the end of the school day. We have a member of staff on the school gates at the end of each day; Mr Semmens at the Rec Road gate and Mr Eastwood at the The Nebule Destruction

Church Street gate. If the children can't see the adult that they are expecting to go home with, they must return to the member of staff on the gate and they will bring them back into school so that we can contact their parents or carers. If for some reason the children can't see the member of staff on the gate they must return to the school office so that we can phone home.

If another parent is going to take a child home with them at the end of the day – for a play date or to help another parent out – all parties must know about this arrangement before doing so.

We remind the children of this regularly in school and by having written signs on all of the doors leading out of the school building. I would be very grateful if you could talk through this process with your children at home too so that they hear it from all angles. Together we can all work to help keep the children safe at all times.

Could I also remind you that if you are collecting children, please do not allow younger children to come onto the playground and play whilst waiting. This can be distracting for children and teachers who are still in school until 3.15pm. Thank you.

# TALK HOMEWORK & WOW WORDS
