Autism Champions

The Nebula SENCOs, 2 of our teaching assistants and I have been attending Autism Champions Training since the start of this year and are sadly nearing the end of this

amazing course. Every half term we have attended training at Keswick Hall and have enjoyed visits from the incredible Anne Etherington, the course instructor, Anne

has worked with children and adults with autism for most of her professional career and her knowledge and warmth make this training some of the best we have ever

Autism Champions—Harnser Federation

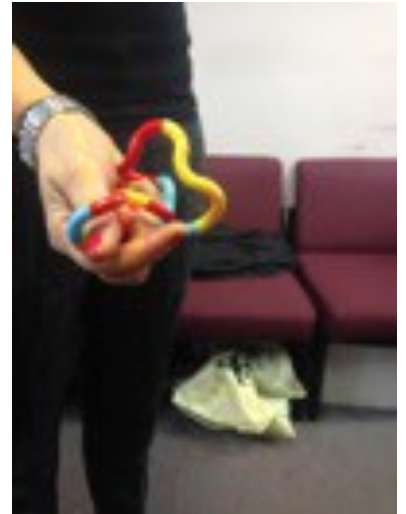
At the Harnser schools we initially looked at communication and anxiety.

Anne Etherington visited and looked at each school's environment and how we could create quiet spaces.

Anne also helped us develop resources to help all pupils communicate that they need help or support with-

out standing out from the rest of the class or group.

We also worked on developing visual timetables for the whole class and individual now/next cards to give pupils a better feel of structure and control over their learning.



Autism Champions—Old Catton Junior School

At Old Catton, Mrs. Hewett has been experimenting with a 'low stimulation' classroom. Her teaching space is very low key with all display spaces being the same pale blue with little work displayed. 'Busy' primary displays can be very distracting, not just for

pupils with ASD. She also developed a colour-coordinated quiet space/work station. Mrs. Hewett welcomes comments on how this environment affects the learning for all member of the school community.



Autism Champions—White Woman Lane Junior

Anne Etherington was very impressed with the variety of alternative learning spaces at White Woman Lane. She particularly liked the library bus, the lodges and the Magic

Room. White Woman Lane had a lot of visual resources available in different spaces and their visual timetables were inspiring for the rest of the Nebula schools to develop further.

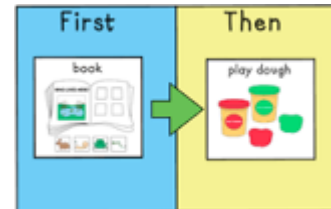


Autism Champions—Horsford Primary

At Horsford we discussed the use of personalised timetables for children who might find a full daily visual timetable overwhelming.

We also looked at using social stories to help the children from the Infant site with their transition to the Junior site.

Anne also helped us find resources to address some specific pupils' sensory needs. Many different areas around the tow sites have been developed to help pupils who have additional sensory needs, including a shed on the infant site and chill-out spaces at the Junior site.
