## Dear Parents

It has been so great to be back in school with all the children. Thank you to everyone who has helped us to settle the children back in. I am sure that many of you have felt nervous about the return and your support, positive feedback and trust have been so important to all the staff. Thank you.

The children have been amazing! They have been quick to learn the new routines we have in place, they have followed their teacher's instructions and listened to how the school now needs to operate. The school has been calm and full of eager children ready to get back to learning.

My favourite things about being back are seeing all the smiling faces and hearing the noise of chatter and laughter back in our building.



## PE kit days

All pupils need to come to school in their PE kits on the days that have PE and Games. The days are as follows for each year group:

**Year 3 Monday and Thursday**

**Year 4 Monday and Tuesday**

**Year 5 Monday and Friday**

**Year 6 Monday and Wednesday**

Please understand that there may be days when the pupils are wearing their kit and they do not do PE or Games. If they are wearing their school uniform on PE days they will still be required to take part in PE. Thank you for sending your children ready in their kit.



## Walking to and from school

We have been asked by the Government to encourage all families to walk, where possible, to and from school. This is to minimise the number of people using public transport, sharing cars with people who may be from different households and to ease the issues of traffic congestion outside schools. Please walk if you live close by and are able and help keep our roads outside school clearer and safer.

## Social Distancing Outside School

This week we have been working extremely hard to make sure that all the children are safe and following the risk assessments we have in place in school. We are following Government Guidance at all times. The bubbles are kept separate all day in school. I have received some emails from parents and carers saying that they feel the end of the day is not operating safely. We have therefore changed the entry and exit gate for Year 4, so that they can use the gate at the top of the field, leading to the Recreation Ground. I needed to have agreement from the Parish Council that this was possible. This has now been agreed and should make a significant difference to the amount of people needing to use the Church Street gate and therefore help keep the paths less busy.

We have staggered the times so that the bubbles are separate. If you have a 3:15pm collection, please stand nearer the gate to wait for your child. If you have a 3:20pm collection, please stand out of the way until the first year group have left school and moved away from the gates with their adult. This will now only apply to year 5 and year 6 as year 3 and 4 now have separate gates.

In order to help us all keep safe – we need your help. Please wait patiently for your child to come out of school. Please maintain social distancing when waiting outside school. You may need to queue on the pavement and wait for your child to be ready to leave school. You can see that we are trying very hard to make sure that the children come out safely to you. Please do not shout to them or encourage them to run over to you. Everything is taking longer at the moment so please wait until your child is dismissed by a member of staff. When you have your child with you, please do not congregate with other families. Please make your way home promptly so that the school gates are clear.

Thank you for working in partnership with the school, ensuring that we are doing everything that we can to make the busiest times in the day safe for all of our community.

## Extra drink in the packed lunch box

We are finding that in the warm weather the children are thirsty! If you are providing a packed lunch, please include an extra lunchtime drink, (e.g. a carton of juice or flavoured water – no fizzy please!) Thank you.

### Cashless Payment System – ParentPay

We are moving over to a cashless payment system in school. Parents/Carers should have received a text message with a link to our website and further information about this new system. You should also have received, by post, your individual details to enable you to activate your account. We are currently taking payments for school lunch via this system however this will be increased over time to include school uniform payments followed by school trips and events, as and when we are able to run them. The system also enables us to include electronic communication and consent requests regarding activities and events. We would therefore encourage all parents/carers to activate their accounts ASAP so that they are ready for such a time that you will require them.

The teething problems we were experiencing at the beginning of this week have been ironed out and the system is working fully for lunch payments. ### No bags in school!

Just a reminder that we are not allowing school bags into school. The only items allowed into school are a named lunch box, water bottle and coat. If medication is required in school this will need to be taken, by an adult, to the front of school and signed in with a member of staff.

### Sanitary items for girls in school

Without having their bags in school on a daily basis, we are aware that many of the girls may want to have their own toiletry bag in school to keep their sanitary items in. This may apply to the girls who have started their periods and the girls who would just like the security of knowing that they have their own bags in school should they need them. We fully understand this.

If your daughter would like to bring a toiletry bag into school, it will need to be named and it will need to stay in school.

Their class teachers can keep their bags safely and privately in their rooms so that if they need access to them we can discreetly help them to use them in school.

Any pain relief for period pain needs to be treated as medication and signed in at the front of school as with any other medication needed in school.

We also have an emergency supply of sanitary items in the school office and we will make sure that the girls know that if they need them, we can help them access them in school.

All members of staff are aware that this may be an issue for the girls and one that is personal and sometimes creates anxiety. We want to make sure that all the girls feel supported and comfortable with this important area of their personal development.
