

Update for items allowed in school – spare shoes for inclement weather

When the weather is very wet or if we have snow, the children can bring a spare pair of shoes, in a carrier bag, into school. All items need to be clearly named. For example; this allows the children to wear wellies to walk to school and have a dry pair of school shoes or trainers to change into. Any school bags or items not permitted, will be kept outside, under the canopy until they can be taken home at the end of the day. The updated permitted items for children to bring into school are:

- A named lunchbox and water bottle
- A coat or sunhat (weather dependant)
- Reading book
- A carrier bag containing a spare pair of shoes, in inclement weather
- Any medication that needs to be signed in at the front of school by a parent/carer after you have dropped your child off at their allocated gate

We are also unable to allow the children to bring in treats to hand out to their class on their birthdays. I am very sorry about this and of course wish it could be different. However for now, we must comply with the risk assessments and keep home/school transfer of items to a minimum. Thank you for your understanding.

Flu Immunisations 2020

Please can you make sure that you have completed the online permission for your child to have the nasal flu immunisation this Autumn Term. The school-based nasal flu immunisation programme requires that you submit the form to say if you give consent or that you decline this immunisation. Either way, the form needs to be completed. In order for any child to receive the immunisation, parental consent MUST be given. The deadline for the form to be submitted is 30th September 2020. We have emailed out the letter this week. TALK HOMEWORK & WOW WORDS

Each week we send a Talk Homework activity and 'Wow' Words home and we would be very grateful for your support.

We are trying to help all our children develop excellent speaking and listening skills, which in turn will help them with their writing. "If a child can't say a sentence then they can't write it either!"



Here are some of the new emojis being released in 2020. They range from including the recognisable hand gesture from Italy – pinching the fingers together to mean "perfect" to an anatomical heart and recognising different types of relationships, gender identities and roles in society. If you could invent an emoji what would it be and why? Discuss this with your family at home and bring your ideas to your class discussion. You could even draw what they emoji would look like to show everyone your idea.

In Big Talk, we use '**WOW' Words** to improve our vocabulary and 'big up' our sentences to make them more interesting!

Our 'WOW' Word this week is

Emotion (feeling, sentiment, sensation, reaction, response.)

- We will encourage the children to use the WOW word throughout the week.
