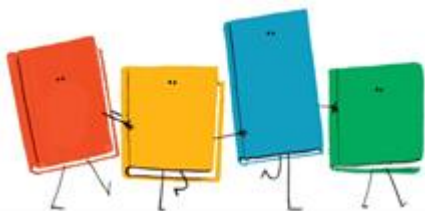
Mrs Shand, a Teacher from White Woman Lane, contacted Sarah Maycock, the author of 'Sometime I
