

Robot Engineers

Would your child like to be a Robot Engineer? If so this Holiday Club is for them! The day consists of building, designing and coding a Robot to complete the challenges set by Evil Engineer Stuart!

This Holiday Club will be a full day event inspiring young minds in the world of robotics and computer programming.

JitterBugs

The JitterBugs holiday club will allow your child the opportunity to create their very own creature (a battery powered jitterbug), diving into the wild world of unusual creatures. The jitterbugs can also be taken home at the end of the day!

This Holiday club will allow your child to learn about different types of creatures and habitats in the world.

Stuck in Space

Stuck in Space is a holiday club where the children will work in teams to rescue a team member who is stuck outside the spaceship! The teams will have a box of resources from which they need to design a rescue pod. The teams will have to design a structure to support the lost team member without touching the fiery lava floor of a distance planet.

This holiday club will allow your children to explore engineering and designing structure fit for purpose, as well as problem solving and teamwork.

The Marble Coaster

The Marble Coaster is a session where children will use cardboard to design a marble run. They will need to design a run which lasts for a minimum of 30 seconds and with the view to making it as fast as possible.

This Holiday Club will turn your child into a mini engineer as they will have to learn about potential energy, friction, angles of the slope, different material properties and have fun!

Here your child will be have to solve a number of engineering challenges set by industry experts, from building structures to solving a problem using many different skills to designing the fastest car.
